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Public Information Guide: Palisades Fire

Update: January 11, 2025, 0038 AM

Current Fire Status:

- **Size:** 21,596 acres
- **Containment:** 8%
- **Structures:** Over 5,000 damaged or destroyed (Malibu and Pacific Palisades)
- **Damage Assessment:** Malibu Building inspectors are conducting rapid visual assessments; number of damaged/destroyed structures TBD
- **Injuries:** 3* (Per CalFire Report)
- **Fatalities:** 2* (Per CalFire Report)
- **Fire Limits:** At this time, the fire has extended beyond the burn scar of the Franklin Fire, although it is not advancing further into Malibu City limits.
- **Weather Conditions 1/11/25 12:38 AM:** Lower winds 5 mph, gusts up to 8 mph blowing from the South/Southeast and humidity 19%.

- The City is establishing multiple information distribution points throughout Malibu to ensure residents have access to the latest updates and resources.
- Residents are encouraged to check with these locations for critical information if connectivity remains limited.

Santa Monica - Malibu Unified School District – UPDATE

Malibu schools will be closed Monday, January 13, 2025. Air quality, road access, evacuation orders and still a fire threat are the reasons for the decision of the School District.

Santa Monica schools will be announced on Sunday by 5:30 p.m. Unfortunately, the situation is too fluid to make an immediate decision. The School District is monitoring all conditions and based on our criteria, will announce that decision on Sunday.

The Santa Monica Boys & Girls Club and YMCA will be open for childcare support providing locations to local families from Santa Monica and Malibu. Locations are available in Culver City area and also in Oxnard and Canoga Park.

Utility Updates:

Southern California Edison (SCE):

The following circuits remain de-energized due to the Public Safety Power Shutoff (PSPS):

- Serra
- Nicholas
- Merlin
- Maguire
- Galahad
- Cuthbert

Southern California Gas (SoCalGas):

- SoCalGas is actively monitoring multiple fires in Los Angeles County, including the Palisades Fire in Pacific Palisades/Malibu, Eaton Canyon Fire in Altadena/Pasadena, and Hurst Fire in Sylmar.
- Crews are coordinating with first responders and standing by to assess impacts.
- **Service Impacts:**
 - The gas main has been shut off from **Neptune's Net to Topanga**.
 - Natural gas service has been temporarily shut off to the Malibu community, from Brentwood Country Club to Pepperdine University. Approximately 15,000 customers are currently affected.
 - Gas service will be restored once it is safe to do so. SoCalGas may need to shut off service in additional areas for public safety.
- **Customer Guidance:**
 - Customers should not attempt to restore gas service on their own. SoCalGas crews will assist with service restorations.

- **Restoring service requires an in-home safety check**, and an adult must be present. Please allow access to SoCalGas personnel to gas meters to expedite the restoration of gas service.
- Customers will not be billed for gas service during the outage.
- Flexible payment arrangements and bill forgiveness may be available for customers directly impacted by fire damage or displacement.

Do Not Drink Water Advisory: Due to a low-pressure event related to the Palisades Fire, the Los Angeles County Waterworks District No. 29 (LACWD) and the State Water Resources Control Board - Division of Drinking Water are issuing a mandatory Do Not Drink Water Notice in the following areas:

- Sunset Mesa community (from Topanga Beach and Coastline Dr. South to Shoreheights Dr. North).
- Malibu coastal areas from Topanga Canyon Rd. to Carbon Canyon Rd., including Big Rock community and Carbon Mesa community.

Please only drink boiled water or bottled water until the notice is lifted.

Unhealthy Air Quality Declared due to Palisades Wildfire: The South Coast Air Quality Management District, has declared unhealthy air quality from the Palisades Fire Event, impacting northwest coastal Los Angeles County including Malibu, Pacific Palisades and areas near the fire.

- The following recommendations will help you protect yourself and your family from harmful effects of bad air quality:
- Stay indoors to limit exposure, especially if you have heart or lung conditions, are elderly, or have children.
- Keep indoor air clean by closing windows and doors. Use air conditioners that recirculate air to filter out harmful particles. Wear an N95 or P100 mask if you must go outside in smoky conditions for long periods of time in areas with heavy smoke or where ash is present.
- Avoid using fireplaces, candles, or vacuums. Clean dusty surfaces with a damp cloth and don't smoke.
- Avoid leaving your pets outdoors, particularly at night. Pets should be brought into an indoor location, such as an enclosed garage or a house.

Fuel Availability:

- **All gas stations in Malibu are currently non-operational.**

Residents and visitors are advised to fuel vehicles outside the Malibu area before traveling or evacuating.

Traffic Signal Status:

The following intersections on Pacific Coast Highway (PCH) are affected:

- **Dark Signals:**
 - PCH & Carbon
 - PCH & Rambla Pacifico
 - PCH & Las Flores
 - PCH & Big Rock
 - PCH & Topanga Canyon
- **Flashing Signal:**
 - PCH & Corral Canyon

Drivers are urged to treat dark signals as four-way stops and proceed with caution.

- Topanga/Mulholland – Southbound
- Old Topanga/Mulholland – Southbound
- Mulholland/Stunt – Southbound

- Malibu Road/Webb Way – Eastbound
- Mulholland/Malibu Canyon – Eastbound
- Pioma/Woodbluffs – Full closure

- Mulholland/Coldwater Canyon – Southbound
- PCH/Cross Creek - Westbound and Eastbound

Repopulation: No repopulations efforts are expected to be scheduled for at least the next 72 hours.

Crime: The Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department is firmly enforcing mandatory evacuations orders. A misdemeanor will be issued to anyone found in an area that is subject to an evacuation order. Sheriff's Crime Suppression Unit is conducting active patrols in all evacuation areas.

Curfew in Effect: Currently the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department is now enforcing a curfew that began at 6:00 pm and will continue to 6:00 am curfew in evacuation zones. Currently no persons, including residents, are being allowed to re-enter the mandatory evacuation zones.

City Updates:

- **City Hall:** Closed
- **Programs:** All City programs are canceled.
- **Schools:** Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District (SMMUSD) schools in Malibu continue to be closed Friday, and Pepperdine University is closed, Spring Semester currently scheduled for Monday January 13.

Key Messages for Residents:

1. Evacuate When Ordered:

- Evacuation orders save lives. If you are told to leave, do so immediately.
- Close all windows and doors, move flammable items away from your home, and leave doors **unlocked** for firefighter access.

2. Stay Informed:

- Power outages are affecting alert systems. Residents must tune into **KBUU 99.1 FM** for real-time updates.
